Kia ora koutou,

I was thrilled to hear the Prime Minister's announcement this afternoon, that we are moving back to Alert Level 2 from 6am on Sunday.

We look forward to welcoming all our students and staff back onsite on Monday 8th March.

Level 2 reminders

At Level 2, all schools are open and all students are required to attend school, unless they are unwell. With our alert Level 2 procedures in place, school is a safe place to be.

We do ask in Level 2 that **parents do not come on to the school grounds** unless your child has just turned 5 years old and is starting school or it is absolutely required. Like previous Level 2 returns, please drop your child at the school gate. Our staff will be there to meet and greet students and support them to their classes. Parents, please also organise a gate spot or a meeting spot nearby that your child is to meet you at once school finishes.

Other Level 2 procedures:

- Parents and caregivers who do enter the school grounds must check-in at the office and register
 on the SchoolApp 'Covid-19 Check-in' or use the visitor register in the office. This is available
 for anyone who cannot use the app and for other visitors who come onsite for any period of
 time.
- QR code posters are displayed at our entrances. We ask our community, if you haven't
 already, to download the NZ COVID Tracer App. You will need to use this if you are
 required to come onsite.
- Parents and caregivers to drop off and pick up only to restrict the number of adults on site. If you are dropping your child off and picking them up, there is no need to sign in as you are not entering the school grounds. If you are entering the school grounds with your child, you are required to sign in and sign out (see bullet points above for how to do this).
- Good hand hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette
- Staying away if sick
- Maintaining the appropriate physical distance from others (in class this means no touching each other and keeping out of breathing distance). Teachers have rearranged classroom furniture and masking tape is positioned on the class mat areas as a visual to support our students with a spaced-out learning spot.
- Our cleaners will clean and disinfect our high touch surfaces daily. Teachers will continue to clean and disinfect tables and desktop surfaces daily.

Thanks again for supporting our school and our community and helping to keep everyone safe.

We know all these things will help to keep our community as safe as possible.
